

## DUAL CREDIT - COSMETOLOGY PROGRAM

During this program, students will be taught the rules and regulations of the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR). They will understand the theory and skills of shampooing, hair and scalp treatment, hair cutting, chemical texture services, hair styling and shaping, manicuring, pedicuring, hair coloring, and facials, facial make-up, advanced nail techniques, disorders/diseases of skin scalp and nails, and safety and sanitation skills.

Upon successful completion of our 42 credit hour and 1500 contact hour program, students receive a Certificate of Proficiency from SPC; and will have acquired the knowledge, skills and experiences necessary to sit for the TDLR exam. To qualify for the Certificate of Proficiency, the student must complete a Capstone Experience during the final semester of the program. After students obtain their TDLR licensure, they are able to work as a cosmetologist in an entry-level position in the State of Texas.

**Each semester during high school, beginning with the junior year, dual credit students have the opportunity to complete one course that is part of the first full semester of the cosmetology program:**

### FIRST COLLEGE SEMESTER (4 SEMESTERS/15 CREDIT HOURS OF DUAL CREDIT)

- CSME1401 Orientation to Cosmetology – Fall of junior year
- CSME1405 Fundamentals of Cosmetology – Spring of junior year
- CSME1443 Manicuring and Related Theory – Fall of senior year
- CSME1310 Introduction to Haircutting and Related Theory – Spring of senior year

**High school graduates may enroll at SPC to finish the next two semesters of the cosmetology program in order to complete program.**

### SECOND COLLEGE SEMESTER (12 CREDIT HOURS)

- CSME 1447 - Principles of Skin Care/Facials and Related Theory
- CSME 1453 - Chemical Reformation and Related Theory
- CSME 2401 - Principles of Hair Coloring and Related Theory

### THIRD COLLEGE SEMESTER (15 CREDIT HOURS)

- CSME 1451 - Artistry of Hair, Theory and Practice
- CSME 2439 - Advanced Hair Design
- CSME 2441 - Preparation for the State Licensing Examination
- CSME 2343 - Salon Development
