Course Level: Introductory

Course Description: Instruction in the artistry of hair design. Topics include theory, techniques, and application of hair design.

End-Of-Course Outcomes: Demonstrate workplace competencies related to the artistry of hair and perform the professional skills of hair design.

Course Competencies: Upon successful completion of this course, the student will:

• Perform analysis of hair structure.

- Confer and organize analysis of hair growth.
- Differentiate in hair distribution.
- Use information and tools in the artistry of hair.
- Produce hairstyles using elements of good hair design.
