TSI-Compliance

Students who are not TSI-compliant in reading or English are advised to take the INRW0300/ENGL1301 corequisite. Successful completion will grant TSI-compliance in these areas and college-credit for ENGL1301. ENGL1302 requires a 'C' or better in the corequisite or approval by the English Chairperson.

Students who are not TSI-compliant in math are advised to take the MATH0314/MATH1314 corequisite. Successful completion will grant TSI-compliance in math and college-credit for MATH1314.

Applicable Transfer Credit Hours

Evaluation of course credit earned at other institutions by the TWU Transfer Evaluation Office does not guarantee approval of the credit for use toward degree requirements. No transferred course completed with a grade below C may be applied to fulfill course requirements in majors, minors, or concentrations. Applicants must submit official records from all accredited institutions attended. Official transcripts must be sent directly to the Office of Admissions. All college-level, non-vocational courses completed with a passing grade of D or above at regionally accredited colleges and universities (not including trade or technical schools) will be evaluated for acceptance of transfer credit by the TWU Transfer Evaluation Office determines acceptable transfer credit based on Common Course Numbers designated by the Texas Coordinating Board of Higher Education or by course content as described from the sending institution's catalog and in consultation with the appropriate academic units at TWU as

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necessary for clarification. While all credit hours presented on the sending institution's transcripts will be evaluated and equivalent college level courses posted to the student's academic record, **25% of the total number of hours for any degree must be completed at TWU**. Courses that are accepted for transfer do not necessarily apply toward college, departmental, or program degree requirements.

Texas Woman's University Uniform Graduation Requirements

Global Perspectives Requirement

In addition to the State of Texas core curriculum, every student must include at least one 3-hour Global Perspectives course or its equivalent that focuses on an interconnected global society that requires an appreciation of the complexity and interdependency of world events and issues.

Assured Admission to Texas Woman's University

Transfer applicants who meet the criteria below will be automatically admitted to TWU. Transfer students will be granted assured admission if they:

- 1. Have earned an Associate of Arts or an Associate of Science degree from a regionally accredited college in the State of Texas; and
- 2. Have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 on a 4.0 scale on all transferable college-level coursework attempted, * (All grades, including Fs, will be considered for calculation of GPA to determine admission to TWU); and
- 3. Are in good standing and eligible to return to the previous institution(s).

NOTE: Students who have earned an Associate of Applied Science degree or the equivalent are not automatically admissible but may be admitted according to regular transfer admission criteria.

Special Educator Preparation Program Admission Requirements

To begin the Educator Preparation Program at Texas Woman's University, students must demonstrate college readiness through coursework or TSIA test scores, have a C or better in EDUC 1301/EDUC 2003, have a minimum 2.75 GPA in the last 60 hours of all coursework at TWU assuming 12 hours have been completed, pass an admission interview, and have 12 to 15 hours of content courses completed, depending on the target certificate.

Additional Texas Woman's University Education Advising Notes

TWU is known for **high quality** teacher preparation. Students typically achieve an overall pass rate of 96 percent on the state teacher exam — meaning students are well prepared to make an impact in the classroom.
