### WHY REAFFIRMATION?

- Allows SPC to continue to award associate degrees and certificates
- Assures that SPC maintains its strong reputation and assures its credits will transfer to other accredited colleges and universities
- Keeps SPC eligible for state and federal funds, such as student financial aid

### **GOALS**

- South Plains College students will develop an Educational Success Plan with the assistance of their academic coach.
- Students will identify and refine their life and career plans.
- Students will establish and progress through their academic plan.



### STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

The Student Learning Outcomes came from a desire to help students reflect on their past, make quality decisions for the present and plan for their future.

- Reflection South Plains College students will reflect on their past experiences to help shape their future academic goals.
- Responsibility South Plains College Students will develop individual responsibility and accountability.
- **Planning** South Plains College Students will learn to set goals in order to help accomplish their current academic and future career plans.



### WHO IS INVOLVED?

### The Student

- The Student is responsible for, and must accept ownership of his or her goals, plans and success.
- The Student will meet with the Academic Coach a minimum of two times each semester.



### The Admissions Advisor

- Admissions Advisors are located in the Admissions and Records Office.
- The Admissions Advisor will instruct the Student in the steps required before meeting with their Academic Coach.
- The Admissions Advisor will assist the Student in scheduling appointments with the Academic Coach.
- The Admissions Advisor will be well versed in ESP@SPC.
- The Admissions Advisors will attend professional development to assist them with their responsibilities.



### The General Academic Coach

- The Guidance and Counseling staff, as well as some others, will be designated as General Academic Coaches.
- By the end of Year One, all Guidance and Counseling Staff will be certified as General Academic Coaches.
- The General Academic Coach will assist students in meeting the identified Goals and Student Learning Outcomes.



### The Program Specific Academic Coach

- The program specific Academic Coach is a faculty member who has completed a prescribed course of professional development.
- By the end of Year Two, all faculty members will be certified as Academic Coaches.
- The Program Specific Academic Coach will assist students in meeting the identified Goals and Student Learning Outcomes.



# PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Specific professional development activities will be determined by the ESP Advisory Council, but will include topics such as:

- Advising best practices
- Assisting students in evaluating personal strengths and challenges and setting goals
- Assisting students in developing responsibility and accountability
- Using ESP technology tools



# **TECHNOLOGY TOOLS**

With ESP@SPC, the Academic Coaches will be given tools to assist with the time-consuming aspects of schedules and academic plans, allowing them time to connect with the students.






#### PROJECTED CHANGES BASED ON DECREASE IN DROPS
