

DUAL CREDIT

Improves Each Student's Life

What is Dual Credit?

Dual Credit refers to the process by which a high school student enrolls in a college course and receives simultaneous academic credit for a course from both the college and the high school. The college course(s), whether academic or career/technical, apply toward high school graduation and a college degree or certificate.

Who is Eligible?

Students who have satisfied the necessary TSI requirements, have permission from their high school counselor or principal and have met South Plains College admission criteria are eligible to enroll in dual credit courses.

Registration

After successfully submitting a dual credit admissions application, each student will receive an email confirming acceptance to South Plains College. The email will contain each student's username and password. Dual credit students will be enrolled after submitting a Dual Credit Approval Form to the Dual Credit Office.

Fees

Dual credit students are charged \$60 per credit hour. Payment for dual credit courses can be made online or through the SPC Business Office. If you have questions, please call the Business Office at (806) 894-9611 extension 2400, 2408, or 2409.

Dropping a Course

Dropping from dual credit courses must be initiated with the high school counselor and is not complete and official until it is received in the Admissions and Records Office at SPC. Student must contact their high school counselor for the dual credit drop form and more information.

Grades

Dual Credit students may check their grades at the end of the semester by logging in to MySPC and accessing TexanConnect.

Transcript

Students may obtain a copy of their official South Plains College transcript by completing an online request through MySPC or by visiting http://www.southplainscollege.edu/transcripts.php

An unofficial transcript is available by logging in to MySPC and accessing TexanConnect.

Important Info for Students

- SPC information goes directly to dual credit students via each student's SPC Gmail account.
- College records are permanent and will follow students to colleges/universities upon high school graduation.
- Parent/guardians will not have access to student college records - including absences, grades and course progress due to FERPA guidelines. Students may release specific information to designated individuals, by completing an Authorization to Release Student Information form.
- Students must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 ("C" or better in all classes) and a minimum pace of 67%. Failure to do so may affect eligibility for financial aid upon high school graduation until GPA requirements are met.
