Course Description

SPAN 2311 is an intermediate-level Spanish course emphasizing more independent language use.

Course Sequencing & Enrollment Policy

A grade of C or higher in SPAN 1412 (or equivalent) is required for enrollment.

Spanish courses are sequential, and students may not be concurrently enrolled in more than one Spanish course during the same semester.

Course Modality & Expectations (Online)

This course is delivered online and is not self-paced. Students are expected to engage in coursework at least three times per week and maintain steady progress throughout the semester.

Instructional Platform

LingroHub (¡Arriba! 2.0) is the primary instructional platform for this course. All coursework, tutorials, assignments, recordings, and exams are completed in LingroHub.

Blackboard is used for posting course announcements, providing access to course documents, and reporting final grades.

LingroHub Access & Registration

Students must register for LingroHub to access course materials and complete all required assignments.

Communication Policy

Types of Assignments

Assignments include LingroHub SAM activities, textbook-based reading activities (TXT), extra practice activities, practice tests, grammar and vocabulary tutorials, recorded speaking activities, and exams.

Assignments, Attempts, and Feedback

Many assignments allow students to check answers inline before submitting work for a grade. Most assignments allow up to two graded submissions, with the highest score recorded. Some assignments, such as recordings, are graded manually and may temporarily display a score of zero until grading is completed.

Late Work Policy

Late work is not accepted. Students are encouraged to communicate proactively if illness or personal circumstances arise. At the instructor’s discretion, limited flexibility may be extended for pending (not overdue) assignments when communication occurs in advance. Any consideration will be applied consistently and fairly.
