What is Audio Video Production?

AVP is a Career and Technical Education class taught by Frenship.TV staff members. Students will be preparing for life after high school with special emphasis on media and communications. Using industry standard audio and video equipment and techniques, students will focus on learning to write, shoot, and edit their own videos! Students will work in a state-of-the-art TV studio and broadcast Memorial Panther sporting events, as we capture excellence over this school year.

Some other things you need to know:

- This class **requires** work outside of the classroom. This includes but is not limited to being a crew member during our live sports broadcasts, filming videos/events outside of the classroom, and completing necessary assignments.
- **All students are expected** to participate in our Career and Technical Student Organizations such as SkillsUSA, Business Professionals of America and Student Television Network.

What supplies do you need?



- Students ARE NOT required to bring an SD card for the class, but if they would like to have their own for the class – it is encouraged. (I am not responsible for a student's personal SD Card.)
- 1 folder with pockets and brads
- *Recommended* Personal wired headphones 🎧 A class set is available, so this is personal preference.

If there is an issue or questions regarding any of these items...PLEASE let your teacher know ASAP!.

What does grading look like?

- Videos, projects, and tests will be weighted equally (100%) under the Assessments category in the gradebook. There will be a minimum of 6 grades here (probably more).
- Since creating videos can be subjective, each video/project assigned will be graded using a rubric.
- A daily work category will go in the gradebook and will have an attached rubric for each assignment.
- Per Fisd policy, if an assignment is 1 day late (without a verified excuse) = 10 points deducted, 2 days late = 20 points deducted, 3 days late = 30 points deducted, 4 days late = 40 points deducted, 5+ days late = 50 points deducted.

One of those grades every 6 weeks will be Crew Credits. The goal of Crew Credits is to get the students' real world experience outside of the classroom.

Each student must earn 1 Crew Credits per 6 weeks grading period in AVP I & in AVP II.

- These are mostly earned by serving as a crew member during one of our live broadcasts.
 - If you sign up, show up, participate in whatever role you are assigned for that event.... You earn a 100! (You can also earn crew credits at any video production gigs outside of class – these could include working on the video crew at your church; filming a Frenship event or doing a completed video outside of class.) If you have questions on what could qualify – please come and speak to your teacher.

- You can earn your crew credits at any point in the 6 weeks. They do not roll over.

Classroom, Expectations:

- Be courteous and kind.
- Your time at the A/V is short. Hurry to class.
- Be respectful of other students and your teachers, as well as yourself.
- This is a TV station and is a professional environment, and we are expected to produce professional content for the station/school district.

TV Expectations of Professionalism:

- Our class is taught by Frenship.Tv Staff Members. So, lucky you...you have more than one teacher here! You will frequently be working with Frenship.Tv staff members in addition to the teacher whose name you see on your schedule.

Respect towards all students, staff members, and guests of Frenship ISD and Frenship.Tv is expected.

- There is Audio and Video being recorded at the station every day. Therefore, language and behavior will always be professional.
- Each day, you will work with industry-standard equipment. Misuse and/or mistreatment is grounds for loss of privilege and will result in alternate assignments a
- You can find Frenship.TV on Optimum Channel 14, as well as our social media outlets Frenship.Tv on Facebook and Instagram. Therefore, all projects will be appropriate and subjective to approval by Mr. Ward & the Frenship.Tv Staff.
- If you miss class, it is **your responsibility** to find out how you need to make it up!
- **We want you to check out the equipment!** But...it cannot interfere with class, and you always must return it the next class day!
