

# Graphic Design Course Syllabus

## Course Description

In our everyday world, we are surrounded by design—from the automobile to cereal boxes, computers, toothbrushes, magazine covers, CD covers, clothing and much more. Through this course we will explore the world of graphic design. What skills does it take to design a logo, packaging or a poster? Through the relationship of text and visual images you will create projects that could be used in marketing, advertising, or communicating an effective message to others. Students will also have the opportunity to analyze the outcome of their work and present it as if they were selling it to a client.

## Course Objectives

By the end of this course, students will be able to:

- Understand concepts and tools related to graphic design and digital art.
- Master skills basic to image manipulation, digital illustration, product and advertising design.
- Understand the fundamentals and applications of digital illustration and graphic design.

## Required Materials

- Desktop computers, drawing tablets, and software are provided for student use in the classroom.
- Students will occasionally need something to write or sketch with.
