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Course Supplies:

- A spiral notebook for taking notes during class.

- (Recommended) A 1" 3-ring binder with dividers to keep graded papers and tests OR a dedicated folder.

Student Expectation:

- Come to class prepared and ready to take notes and learn.

Student Learning Outcomes: Upon completion of this course and receiving a passing grade, the student will be able to:

1. Compute the values of trigonometric functions for key angles in all quadrants of the unit circle measured in both degrees and radians.
2. Graph trigonometric functions and their transformations.
3. Prove trigonometric identities.
4. Solve trigonometric equations.
5. Solve right and oblique triangles.
6. Use the concepts of trigonometry to solve applications.

Technology: This class will primarily utilize Google Classroom for all lecture materials, class videos, announcements, and bell ringers. Blackboard will not be used for this class. MyOpenMath will be used for online homework assignments.

Homework/Quizzes:

- Homework will be assigned at the end of each section of notes and is **due 2 class days after the assigned day at 11:59pm**. Homework will be completed online via MyOpenMath. Assignments will still be available for completion after the due date, but 10% will be deducted for each question completed after the due date. Each student will receive 25 late passes that can be used at any time to complete late homework assignments (you must use 1 late pass per day late).
- **Quizzes will be given the day after an assignment is due.** The quiz will be taken at the beginning of class and will be turned in immediately. Quizzes will be on paper and consist of 2-5 questions similar to the homework. Quizzes must be taken without the use of notes.
- Students are encouraged to keep graded assignments in a 3-ring binder or folder to be used as a reference and study guide for exams.

Exams:

- There will be four unit exams during the semester and one final exam.
- The final exam will be comprehensive.
- The final exam is tentatively scheduled for **May 7-8**.

Grades:
