GENERAL COURSE INFORMATION:

Course Level: Introductory

Course Description: Presentation of the theory and practice of chemical reformation including terminology, application, and workplace competencies.

End-Of-Course Outcomes: Identify terminology related to chemical reformation; demonstrate the proper application and exhibit workplace competencies related to chemical reformation.

Course Competencies:

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will:

- Select the appropriate product for a chemical wave.
- Perform efficiently the physical process (wrapping) of a chemical wave.
- Process the chemical step (processing solution) of a chemical wave.
- Neutralize the chemical wave effectively and complete properly.
- Select the appropriate product for a chemical hair relaxer.
- Follow the manufacturer’s instructions to perform the chemical hair relaxer.
- Neutralize and properly complete the chemical hair relaxer.
- Perform a minimum of twenty services (fifteen chemical waves and five chemical hair relaxers).

Academic Integrity:

Students who do not meet criteria for restricted enrollment will be counseled regarding their workplace competencies and career goals/objectives.

Attendance Policy:

Punctual and regular attendance is required of all Cosmetology students. Unexcused tardiness and absences will not be tolerated. A doctor's note stating that it is safe to return to school is required in cases of contagious diseases such as pink eye, strep throat or the flu. If more than 5% (8 hours) of this course is missed, student will have to attend make-up days. If student refuses to attend make-up days, then student may be at risk of being withdrawn due to excessive absences. Please refer to the SPC Cosmetology handbook for more information.

Assignment Policy:

All required work must be turned in on time. Assigned work is due on the day/class period assigned by instructor. Late work is generally not acceptable; however special consideration is subject to instructor discretion whether or not the work will be accepted. This syllabus includes chapters 6, 12, 13, 20.

Grading policy/Procedure/Methods of Evaluation:

See the General Catalog "Grades and Reports" for explanation of grades and grade point averages. The course instructor will introduce the college grading policy and method to determine G.P.A. during the course of instruction. The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation demands an overall minimum grade of 70; therefore this course requires the same. **An overall grade below 70 is considered an F.**

Students shall adhere to the safety standards established by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulations, South Plains College and the Cosmetology Handbook. Students in Cosmetology must follow all safe practices in laboratory work areas and other specific topics (dress code, cell phones, etc.). Refer to the Cosmetology Handbook.

CSME 1453 students will demonstrate competencies in the following tasks:

- Understanding and performing chemical waves and chemical hair relaxers.
- Understanding, demonstrating, explaining terminology related to chemical reformation.
- Complete written assignments related to theory and knowledge of chemical reformation.
- Exhibit the use of information and tools related to chemical reformation.
- Complete all performance requirements as enumerated in the course competencies.
