## SPC American History Core Component – 060 Options

Additional options are available to complete the American History Core. *Instead of HIST1301, students can take* HST2327 – Mexican American History I, HIST2381 – African American History I, or \*HIST2301 – Texas History. For HIST1302, students can take HIST2328 – Mexican American History II, HIST2382 – African American History II, or \*HIST2301 – Texas History. Texas History can be used one time to fulfill three of the six hours required.

### **TSI-Compliance**

Students who are not TSI-compliant in reading or English are advised to take the INRW0300/ENGL1301 corequisite. Successful completion will grant TSI-compliance in these areas and college-credit for ENGL1301. ENGL1302 requires a 'C' or better in the corequisite or approval by the English Chairperson.

Students who are not TSI-compliant in math are advised to take the MATH0332/MATH1332 or MATH0314/MATH1314 corequisite. Successful completion will grant TSI-compliance in math and college-credit.

## **Applicable Transfer Credit Hours**

Evaluation of course credit earned at other institutions by the ENMU Transfer Evaluation Office does not decree approval of the credit for use toward degree requirements. Only the academic dean of the college offering the program in which a student is enrolled has authority for determining which courses will be applied toward any specific program. The only exception to this rule is that no transferred course completed with a grade below C- may be applied to fulfill course requirements in majors, minors, or concentrations. Applicants must submit official records from all accredited institutions attended. Official transcripts must be sent directly to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions. All college-level, non-vocational courses completed with a passing grade of D or above at regionally accredited colleges and universities (not including trade or technical schools) will be evaluated for acceptance of transfer credit by the ENMU Transfer Evaluation Office. The ENMU Transfer Evaluation Office determines acceptable transfer credit on the basis of an evaluation of course content as described from the sending institution's catalog and in consultation with the appropriate academic units at Eastern New Mexico University as necessary for clarification. While all credit hours presented on the sending institution's transcripts will be evaluated and equivalent college level courses posted to the student's academic record, a maximum of 80 semester credit hours from two-year colleges may be applied toward Eastern New Mexico University degree requirements. Courses that are accepted for transfer do not necessarily apply toward college, departmental, or program degree requirements.

### Admission to ENMU as a Transfer Student

Going to Eastern is easy! Best of all, applying to ENMU is free! Our admission process requires submitting the following documents:

ENMU admission application – you can fill out our online application or download an application and mail it to us at the address below.

- FAFSA application (Eastern's FAFSA school code is 002651).
- Official copies of transcripts from all colleges and universities you have attended previously.

If you have completed less than 30 college credits, you will also need to submit an official copy of your high school transcript or GED
certificate and ACT or SAT scores.

## Using this Transfer Advising Guide with ENMU

This Transfer Advising Guide represents ENMU's degree plan and is subject to change at the university's discretion. It is intended for advising purposes only so students know exactly which courses they can take at South Plains College and have the courses count towards degree requirements when they transfer to ENMU. It is highly recommended that students meet with their assigned academic advisor to review all graduation and transfer requirements listed in the Transfer Advising Guide.

The ultimate goal is to provide students with accurate information for transfer pathways while minimizing loss of credits in transfer. Students are encouraged to review ENMU's requirements frequently.

The Transfer Advising Guide is based upon ENMU's catalog and is subject to change.

### **Texas 135-Mile Tuition Waiver**

Amount: waives the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition

**Eligibility:** live within 135 miles of ENMU-Portales, renewal is automatic and is not based on GPA or number of hours taken.

**Application deadline:** there is no application required for this waiver, it will be automatically applied to your account if you meet the eligibility requirements.

# **Scholarships**

Scholarships are awarded by Enrollment Services, the <u>ENMU Foundation</u> and various academic departments to current and incoming students. The Office of Financial Aid administers these funds after they have been awarded.

# **Transfer Academic Scholarship**

Amount: \$200-\$700 per academic year

**Application deadline:** for priority consideration, apply by Aug. 1 for fall and Jan. 3 for spring. Applications may be considered until two weeks prior to the beginning of the semester. In order for us to be able to process your scholarship application, you should <u>apply for admission</u> first, because you won't be eligible to receive an Admissions Scholarship until you are admitted to ENMU.

Eligibility: have a 3.5 or higher cumulative college GPA

**Continuation:** may be awarded up to four consecutive semesters or receipt of degree (whichever comes first) if you complete at least 15 hours with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.

# Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship

**Amount:** in-state: \$450 per semester; Out-of-state: \$450 per semester, plus a waiver of the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition. Only a limited number of this scholarship are awarded.

Eligibility:

- Be a Phi Theta Kappa member with a 3.5 cumulative college GPA, who has earned an associate degree or minimum of 60 hours of college credit.
- Proof of Phi Theta Kappa membership is required. Please provide a copy of your membership card.

**Application deadline:** for priority consideration, apply by Aug. 1 for fall and Jan. 3 for spring. Applications may be considered until two weeks prior to the beginning of the semester. In order for us to be able to process your scholarship application, you should <u>apply for admission</u> first, because you won't be eligible to receive an Admissions Scholarship until you are admitted to ENMU.

May be awarded up to four consecutive semesters or receipt of degree (whichever comes first) if you complete at least 15 hours with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher.

## **Transfer Competitive Waiver**

**Amount:** waives the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition (Colorado Scholar and Texas 135-Mile scholarships awarded separately, see below.)

**Application deadline:** for priority consideration, apply by Aug. 1 for fall and Jan. 3 for spring. Applications may be considered until two weeks prior to the beginning of the semester. In order for us to be able to process your scholarship application, you should <u>apply for admission</u> first, because you won't be eligible to receive an Admissions Scholarship until you are admitted to ENMU.

**Eligibility:** Meet one of the following requirements:

- 3.5 cumulative college GPA
- 3.0 cumulative high school GPA and a 23 ACT or 1060 SAT score (national test)
- 3.5 cumulative high school GPA and a 20 ACT or 940 SAT score (national test)

**Continuation:** may be awarded up to four consecutive semesters or receipt of degree (whichever comes first) if you complete at least 12 hours with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher.
